## *Instructions*

Just like the "Mad Libs" you are used to, but Holiday themed. Simply fill in the space with the suggested word type. If you see a word with an \* that matches another word with an \*, that means those words should be the same. For example if one blank says Christmas Animal\* and you see another word suggestion that says Christmas Animal\*, those two should be the same. Once you have filled in each blank with the word suggested read it aloud.

You can play this with a group of people or individually. If you are playing with a group, choose one person to write and call out the word type and go in a circle giving the answers for each different word type until the entire story has been completed. Have the person who wrote the suggested words read your story aloud.
